RECOMMENDATION

Elect a chair and vice chair to oversee the formal proceedings of the Parks and Recreation Commission for the period March 2026 through February 2027.

PRIOR ACTION/VOTE

On May 1, 2018, the City Council provided direction to staff to return at a future meeting and they directed staff to keep two unscheduled vacancies open until the Annual Recruitment in the fall for January terms (Vote: 4-0).¹

On May 15, 2018, the City Council introduced Ordinances to add Alternate Commissioners, amended the Commission terms to four years, and adopted Resolution No. 18-3905 that revised Policy No. 100-07 for appointment of Commissioners/Committee (Vote: 4-0).²

On March 6, 2025, the Parks and Recreation Commission elected Paul Parker as Chair (Vote: 5-0).³

On March 6, 2025, the Parks and Recreation Commission elected Robin Gilliland as Vice-Chair (Vote: 5-0).⁴

BACKGROUND

The Parks and Recreation Commission serves as a vital link between the community and local government, playing an essential role in fostering public engagement, reviewing programs, and shaping policies that enhance the quality of life for Murrieta residents. As stewards of the City's recreational resources and advocates for community well-being, the Commission ensures that decisions reflect the needs and aspirations of the community. In alignment with its commitment to effective governance, the Commission conducts an annual reorganization to select its leadership, furthering its ability to serve the public with dedication and purpose.

Murrieta Municipal Code Section 2.40.050 states that "The Parks and Recreation Commission shall elect a chair and vice-chair from among its members at its first regular meeting in February of each year." In this case, the first regularly scheduled meeting following February is March 5, 2026. The officers elected at that meeting

will hold office from March 2026 until the first regular meeting in or after February 2027. The chair supervises the affairs of the Parks and Recreation Commission and presides at its meetings. The vice-chair serves as acting chair when the chair is absent and, during such times, assumes the powers and duties of the chair.

Procedure

The chair (or, in the absence of the chair, the vice-chair) shall open the floor to receive nominations for chair. Once all nominations have been received, the full Commission will formally elect the chair by motion and vote for each nominee (if more than one) in the order nominated. The candidate receiving a majority vote of the entire Commission shall be declared elected.

The vice-chair shall be elected by the Commission from among its appointed members in the same manner and for the same term as the chair.

Murrieta Municipal Code Section 2.32.030(B) states that, "To provide opportunity for professional growth for all board and commission members, the tenure of board/commission chairs is limited to two years." This section limits the tenure of chairs of all boards and commissions to two consecutive years, with the option for the body to make a finding of exceptional circumstances to extend service for an additional year. This provision applies specifically to the role of chair and does not restrict service in other officer positions. Service as vice-chair does not count toward the two-year chair limit, and the code does not establish term limits for the vice-chair role. As a result, the Commission may elect any eligible member to serve as chair or vice-chair during the annual reorganization.

The current chair has served in the capacity of chair for one year and is eligible for re-election. The vice-chair seat has been vacated due to the member relocating outside the Murrieta city limits. As there is no service limitation for the vice-chair role, all current board members are eligible for nomination.

2.40.010 Parks and recreation commission--Established.

There is established a parks and recreation commission. The parks and recreation commission may be known as and referred to as the "Murrieta Parks and Recreation Commission," or as the "Parks and Recreation Commission." (Ord. 495 § 1, 2014; Ord. 194 § 2, 1998; Ord. 25 § 1 (part), 1991; Ord. 3 § 1 (part), 1991; prior code § 2.20.010)

2.40.015 Purpose.

The purpose of the Parks and Recreation Commission is to act in an advisory capacity to the city council and the community services director in all matters pertaining to the community services district through the development and implementation of human services, comprehensive recreation programs, parks, and recreation facilities to meet the needs of all the residents within the city. (Ord. 495, 2014; Ord. 421 § 1, 2009)

2.40.020 Members.

A. The parks and recreation commission shall consist of six (6) members plus up to two alternate members, each of whom shall be appointed by the city council. The membership is to be composed of five (5) members from the community at large, one (1) youth member, and up to two (2) alternates.

B. Appointments shall be for four-year terms, except the youth member, and implemented pursuant to Chapter 2.32 of the Murrieta Municipal Code.

C. The alternate commissioner(s) will be selected by the full city council and membership status is in accordance with Chapter 2.32 of the Murrieta Municipal Code.

D. The youth member shall be a person regularly enrolled in grades 9 -12 of a public or private school operating within the city and shall be appointed by the youth advisory committee, which is under the auspices of the parks and recreation commission. In the event that the youth advisory committee shall fail to appoint the youth member, the city council or its designee shall appoint the youth member. The requirements of Section 2.32.010.D. of this code shall not apply to the youth member. The youth member shall be a non-voting member, and the term of office is one (1) year. 2.40.030 Regular meetings.

The Parks and Recreation Commission shall hold at least one regular meeting every other month at such time and place as designated in the rules and regulations of the commission. Regular meetings may be adjourned by public announcement to a specified date, time and place, and any such adjourned meeting shall be deemed a regular meeting. All meetings shall be open to the public. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. (Ord. 495 § 2, 2014; Ord. 194 § 2, 1998; Ord. 25 § 1 (part), 1991; Ord. 3 § 1 (part), 1991; prior code § 2.20.020)

2.40.040 Absence from meetings.

Absences are addressed in Section 2.32.020.B. of the Murrieta Municipal Code.

2.40.050 Organization and records.

The parks and recreation commission shall elect a chair and vice-chair from among its members at its first regular meeting in February of each year. The commission shall adopt rules and regulations for the transaction of its business and shall cause proper records to be kept of all its official acts and proceedings including minutes, resolutions, actions, findings and

determinations. Minutes, resolutions and recommendations shall be filed with the city clerk with copies to the city manager who shall cause appropriate reports to be made to the city council.

2.40.060 Duties of members.

The Parks and Recreation Commission shall have the following duties:

- A. Act in an advisory capacity to the city council, and the director of parks and recreation in all matters pertaining to parks and public recreation and to cooperate with other governmental agencies and civic groups in the advancement of sound park and recreation planning and programming;
- B. Formulate general policies on recreation services for approval by the city council;
- C. Advise with the director of parks and recreation on development of recreation areas, facilities, programs and improved recreation services;
- D. Recommend the adoption of standards on organization, personnel, areas and facilities, programs and financial support;
- E. Make periodic inventories of recreation services that exist or may be needed and interpret the needs of the public to the city council, and to the director of parks and recreation;
- F. Aid in coordinating the recreation services with the programs of other governmental agencies and voluntary organizations;
- G. Interpret the policies and functions of the parks and recreation department to the public;
- H. Advise the director of parks and recreation in the preparation of the annual budget of the department and a long-range recreation capital improvement program;
- I. Environmental enhancement and beautification, including design review for aesthetic evaluation of landscaped median improvement projects within the public right-of-way. (Ord. 495, 2014; Ord. 210 § 1, 1999; Ord. 25 § 1 (part), 1991; Ord. 3 § 1 (part), 1991: prior code § 2.20.035)

2.40.070 Compensation and expenses.

All members of the Parks and Recreation Commission shall serve without compensation. The city council may from time to time authorize, in advance, expenditures for attendance at seminars, institutes, or other meetings which the city council finds to be beneficial to the members in the performance of their duties and in the best interests of the city. Claims for such expenses shall be filed with the finance director and are subject to audit and approval by the city council. (Ord. 495, 2014; Ord. 194 § 2, 1998; Ord. 25 § 1 (part), 1991; Ord. 3 § 1 (part), 1991: prior code § 2.20.040)

Chapter 2.32

BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS GENERALLY

2.32.010 Commission and alternate appointments.

2.32.020 Terms, vacancies.

2.32.030 Chairpersons, vice-chairpersons-selection-terms.

2.32.010 Commission and alternate appointments.

A. Unless otherwise specifically provided in this code or by state law, all city board and commission appointments, except for ex officio members where applicable, shall be made by the city council in January, following the election of city council members.

B. The city council may select up to two alternate commissioners for each commission in addition to the established commission membership. Initially and thereafter when necessary, alternate commissioners will be selected in January, following the election of city council members. In the event the city council appoints two alternate commissioners to any commission, the alternates shall be designated first alternate and second alternate by the city council.

C. Alternate commissioners shall not become permanent members of their designated commission except by the filling of a vacancy pursuant to Section 2.32.020.C. Alternate members are not eligible to serve as chair or vice chair until they fill a vacancy. Alternates are encouraged to attend their designated commission meetings; they are non-voting members, and they are not counted for quorum purposes. Alternate commissioners shall possess all the qualifications of other commissioners.

D. Unless otherwise provided by law, or by ordinance or resolution of the city council, all members of any board or commission of the city appointed by the city council shall be initially, and during their incumbencies, registered voters within the incorporated city limit boundaries of the City of Murrieta, and shall not at or during incumbency be an employee of the city. (Ord 529 § 1, 2018; Ord. 3 § 1 (part), 1991: prior code § 2.04.060)

2.32.020 Terms, vacancies.

A. Terms.

1. Appointments, except the youth member on the Parks and Recreation Commission, shall be for four-year terms, commencing after city council members take office following the general municipal election in November of even numbered years.

2. The term of an alternate commissioner shall also be four (4) years.

3. In order to transition from a three-year term cycle to a four-year term cycle and to synchronize with the city council member election cycle, those commissioner terms scheduled to expire June 30, 2018 and June 30, 2019, shall expire in January 2019. Commissioner terms scheduled to expire June 30, 2020, shall expire in January 2021.

4. This rule shall not, however, apply in regard to a newly established board or commission to which initial appointments are made. Such initial appointments shall last until the appointment process in January following the next general municipal election.

5. Commissioners may only be removed by a vote of the city council.

6. Any person who has served substantially two full consecutive terms shall not be reappointed to the same board or commission until at least the time equal to one full term has elapsed.

B. Absences. If a commissioner is absent from three consecutive regular meetings without being excused by the commission, or is absent for any reason from more than six (6) regular meetings in any period of twelve (12) months, the office of such commissioner shall thereupon become vacant and shall be filled with any existing alternate commissioner. Except in cases where the mayor, city council member, or city council are not the appointing authority, no person shall be appointed to and serve substantially more than two full consecutive terms upon any single board or commission.

C. Vacancies.

1. If a vacancy in any commission occurs, other than by expiration of term, such vacancy shall be filled by the alternate commissioner selected by the city council during the most recent selection process. If there are two alternate commissioners for the commission on which there is a vacancy, the vacancy shall be filled by the first alternate. The second alternate commissioner will then be designated first alternate. Any alternate appointed pursuant to a vacancy shall serve the remaining term of the seat being filled. Vacancies that occur when no alternate is available for appointment shall be replaced pursuant to Section 2.32.020.C.2. (below).

2. In accordance with Government Code Section 54974 (Maddy Act), a notice of all unscheduled commission vacancies for which no alternate commissioner is available shall be posted in the office of the city clerk and at the public library, not

earlier than 20 days before or not later than 20 days after the vacancy occurs. Final appointment to the commission shall not be made for at least 10 working days after the posting of the notice in the city clerk's office.

2.32.030 Chairpersons, vice-chairpersons—Selection—Terms.

A. Chairpersons, vice-chairpersons - Selection. Unless otherwise provided by law, or by ordinance or resolution, each board and commission of the city shall annually at its first meeting held in February or thereafter, choose one of its number as chairperson and one as vice-chairperson. Each chairperson and vice-chairperson shall have authority and perform such duties as are commonly associated with their respective titles, or as may be specially prescribed by law or by the bylaws or other rules of the board or commission. Vacancies in either such position occurring prior to February may be filled as in the first instance, and a new chairperson or vice-chairperson may be chosen at any time by majority vote of all members of the board or commission.

B. Terms for board/commission chairs. To provide opportunity for professional growth for all board and commission members, the tenure of board/commission chairs is limited to two years. However, the board/commission may make a finding of exceptional circumstances to extend the service of an existing chair for a subsequent year.

- On January 27, Feeding America set up a mobile food distribution site in the Senior Center parking lot from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Feeding America provided 320 free food boxes to seniors and residents in need.
- On January 28, RivCo registrar of voters came out and set up an information table in the lobby to answer questions about upcoming voting and polling locations.
- On January 29, a registered nurse from Grand Canyon University hosted a talk on "Being prepared in emergency situations" during lunch. There were 40 seniors that attended this informative talk.

February

- On February 3, the Senior Center held a free Valentine's card craft. Over 25 seniors joined to make cards for loved ones while enjoying sweet treats and hot chocolate.
- On February 4, Medoptions partnered with a doctor to provide a free informative talk on deprescribing. Over 35 seniors attended this informative talk.
- On February 5, the Office on Aging set up an information booth in the lobby to provide information on the different programs they offer for seniors.
- Additionally, on February 5, the Senior Center held its Big Game Day party. This party is a time for everyone to celebrate the end of the football season by wearing their favorite team jerseys and playing games. There were 55 seniors in attendance at the Big Game Day party.
- From February 9 - 13, staff sold candy grams for Valentine's Day. The seniors had the option to buy as many candy grams as they wanted for friends, family, and loved ones.
- On February 10, Promise Care partnered with a local doctor to provide a doctor talk on "Taking action for your heart" with over 25 seniors in attendance for this talk.
- On February 11, Care Patrol hosted a free DIY Valentine Truck welcome sign. A total of 17 seniors painted and created their very own welcome sign.
- On February 12, Mission Healthcare held their monthly grief support. This group is for any senior that may be dealing with loss. Three seniors attend this support group.
- Additionally, on February 12, staff held a Valentine's Day party for the seniors. Over 50 seniors attended and enjoyed snacks and punch. Everyone had a chance to spin the prize wheel and win a prize.

- On February 13, Royal Benefits Services partnered with a local doctor to host a free Q&A session for our seniors during the lunch hour. Over 30 seniors were in attendance for this session.
- On February 19, Hall Insurance Services hosted its free Tech Table class. Tech class assists seniors with mobile devices and helps them understand different features.
- On February 23, Hospice of the Valley set up an information booth in the lobby to share resources about hospice.
- On February 24, Feeding America set up a mobile food distribution site in the Senior Center parking lot from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Feeding America provided over 300 free food boxes to seniors and residents in need.
- On February 26, the Murrieta Museum opened its door for the seniors to take a tour. Twelve seniors enjoyed learning the history of Murrieta by attending the tour.

Murrieta Youth Center

- The 2025/2026 school year registration remains open, with 302 participants currently enrolled. The Youth Center averages 120 daily afternoon check-ins and approximately 35 daily morning check-ins.
- Program fees remain affordable at \$32.20 for the school year.
- Regular afterschool hours are Monday through Friday from 3:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. with early release Wednesdays from 1:45 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.
- Expanded morning hours have been added this year to include before-school programming from 7:00 a.m. to 8:45 a.m. Morning hours are included with registration.

Spring Camp

- Spring Camp will take place from March 30 through April 3, 2026, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Murrieta Youth Center for children ages 5-12. The camp fee is \$160.00 per participant. Registration opens on March 1.

Youth Advisory Committee (YAC)

- Seven youth are currently participating in the committee.
- The next YAC meeting is scheduled for March 9, 2026.
- YAC members will be supporting upcoming events including Eggstravaganza, Father's Day Car Show, and Birthday Bash.
- When available, YAC members attend the Parks and Recreation Commission Meetings and provide updates to the commission on Youth Center and YAC activities.

Little Learners Dual Language Program

An inclusive program for children ages 3-5, providing foundational building blocks for future academic success in both English and Spanish. This program is held at the Copper Canyon Facility.

- Cost per participant: \$208.60
- Schedule: Monthly sessions are held Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
- January enrollment: 10 participants
- February enrollment: 9 participants
- March session is from March 3-26, with four children currently enrolled.
- This program continues to receive positive feedback, and staff are hopeful for continued growth.

Youth Alternative Recreation Program (Youth ARP)

- This newly launched program serves children ages 5-12 with intellectual and developmental

disabilities, promoting inclusion, socialization, and peer engagement through themed activities, crafts, games, and more.

- Youth ARP events are held on the last Friday of each month from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
- The most recent even took place on Friday, February 27, at Copper Canyon Park.
- Participation fee free.
- February enrollment: 2 participants
- March enrollment: 2 participants
- Staff are excited to continue building this inclusive and engaging program for the community.

Adult Alternative Recreation Program (ARP)

- On January 9, staff hosted a “ARP Social Lounge Live” event with 77 participants and caregivers. This event had a live band featuring “No Hard Feeling.” Band members interacted with the participants. Snacks and drinks were provided.
- On January 23, ARP had a “Karaoke Night” with 46 participants. A DJ was present to help with the karaoke. Participants also had the opportunity to play board games or do puzzles. They also made a sensory music bottle. Drinks and snacks were provided.
- On February 13, members participated in the much-anticipated Valentine’s Dance “Hearts in Harmony,” 117 participates plus 70 guests attended. This event was sponsored by the Murrieta Rotary Club. Care-Rite donated corsages and boutonnieres and assisted with distributing invitations. Dinner and dessert were served. DJ played music while the participants danced. A photographer took pictures that were handed out. Another photographer took candid pictures and provided a link to the page where they can download the pictures they liked. City of Murrieta staff handed out water bottle souvenirs with chocolate hearts, and a music note key chain. This event was at no cost to the participants and guests.

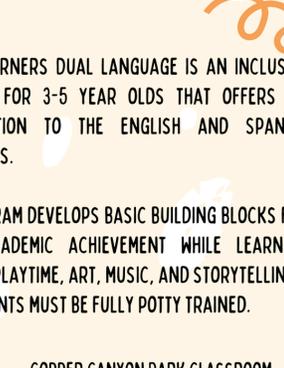

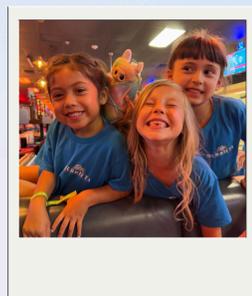

BACKGROUND

Special Projects, Construction, and Capital Improvement Plan Update

Military Banner Program

- The application deadline has closed for 2026 banners.
- 44 applications were received, 24 active-duty, 20 veterans.
- New banners will be installed in May, prior to Memorial Day.
- Active-duty banners will be installed downtown.
- Veteran banners will be installed in Town Square Park.
- 31 banners will be retired in May.
- A banner retirement ceremony will take place in July at Town Square Park Amphitheater.

Library Expansion

- Rain has caused significant delays, currently 30 days behind.
- Current projected completion date: November 2026.

- Construction Status:
 - Foundation footings poured.
 - Foundation pour scheduled for first half of March.
- Weekly progress meetings take place at the library each Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.
- Contract Change Orders:
 - Replacement of existing, outdated fire alarm system APPROVED.
 - Under Consideration
 - Painting of existing exterior.
 - Correction of front sidewalk.
 - Replacement of fabric coated acoustic wall panels (lower ones in reach only) in existing children's space with easier to maintain gypsum board.

Alderwood Pickleball Courts

- Construction is in progress with an expected completion and ribbon cutting in spring 2026.
- Striping to take place across all courts from March 16-27. Courts will be closed for two weeks.

Cal Oaks Tennis Court Lighting

- Project is complete.
- Parks Maintenance Supervisor Josh Havens is to redesign the reservation signs on the courts so that the public understands that they need to make a reservation to turn on the lights with a QR code that takes them to the reservation page.

Sports Field Synthetic Turf Replacements

- Turf renovation at the Los Alamos Hills Sports Park soccer field was completed on January 29, 2026.
- Construction to start on the Torrey Pines Park baseball field beginning March 2 and is expected to be completed in late April of 2026.

Alderwood Park Tech Improvements

- Staff are waiting for a new utility cabinet to be installed.
- Alarm and camera system has been installed.

Flock Cameras

- Two PTZ cameras are on back order.
- Maintenance needs to run electrical to the poles that do not have solar.
- One post needs to be installed.
- Staff training to be in March.

Parks Maintenance - Repairs, Inspections, Miscellaneous

- Maintenance staff have installed lighting in the Equestrian Park archery area.
- Murrieta Mesa High School senate team is scheduled to have a painting project at the Equestrian Park on March 9 where they will be painting the fence.
- Maintenance staff are continuing to find solutions for the ground squirrel problem at Hunt Park and the Youth Center yard.
- A cricket pitch has been completed in the outfield of the ball field at Mapleton Park.

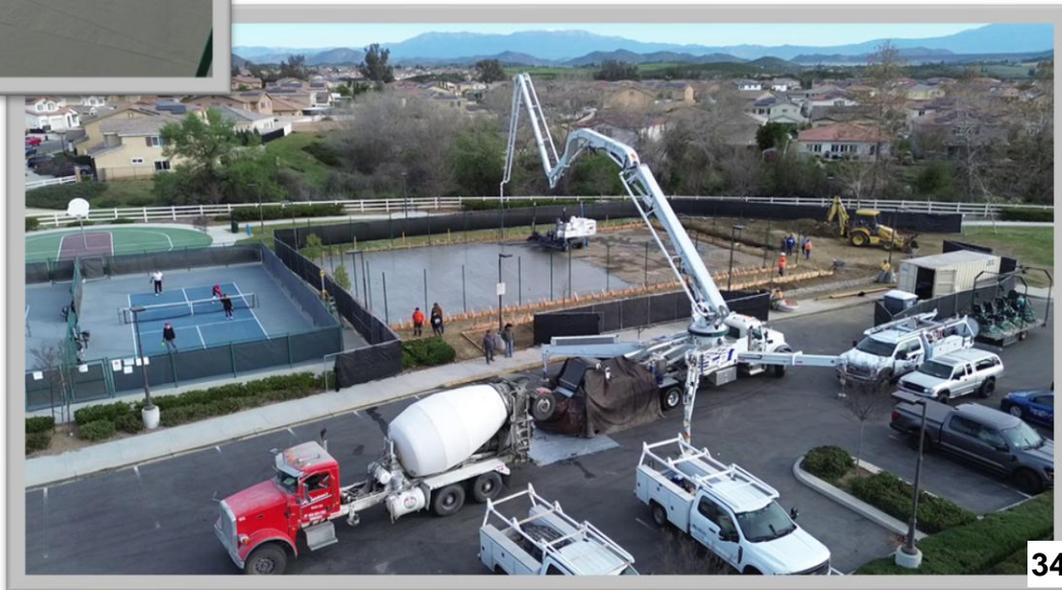

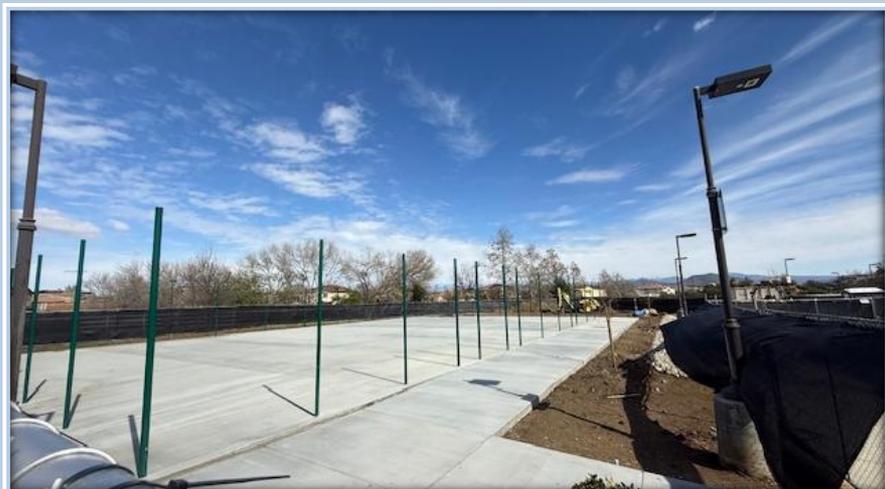

On March 6, 2025, the Parks and Recreation Commission approved the final Park Assignments.

CITY COUNCIL GOAL

Coordinate and deliver responsive, effective community services.

BACKGROUND

The Parks and Recreation Commission plays an important role in supporting the quality, safety, and functionality of City parks. Assigning Commissioners to specific parks provides additional eyes on facilities, helping staff identify issues early and maintain high standards of care. Through regular spot-checks, Commissioners can observe park conditions, note areas needing attention, and help ensure that parks remain safe, clean, and welcoming for all residents. This collaborative approach strengthens both maintenance efficiency and community engagement.

The Parks Maintenance Division in the Municipal Services Department continues to perform routine maintenance such as emptying trash, cleaning restrooms, removing graffiti, addressing liabilities and vandalism, and making repairs or noting deficiencies. Commissioners complement this work by conducting informal inspections of their assigned parks and reporting observations to staff.

The attachment to this report is the Park Assignment Form, which Commissioners may use while reviewing facilities. The form provides a structured way to note and track needed corrections. Issues such as fallen trees, broken irrigation, graffiti, vandalism, or other maintenance concerns may be reported directly to staff by phone or email, submitted using the Park Assignment Form, or reported through the City's Fix-it App.

Once a park review is completed, Commissioners using the form may submit it to staff for review and follow-up. Completed forms may be scanned and emailed, dropped off at City Hall, or provided to staff at the next Commission meeting for non-urgent items.

The Commission last discussed park assignments in March 2025. Since that time, Commissioner Gilliland has relocated outside the Murrieta city limits, resulting in the vacancy of her seat.

ALTERNATIVES

1. **Table the discussion until the vacant Commission seat is filled.**
Delays reassignment until the new Commissioner is appointed, allowing the full Commission to participate in the distribution of responsibilities.

4. **Reassign only high-priority or high-use parks at this time and defer the remainder.**
Ensures coverage for parks with greater maintenance needs or public use while postponing full redistribution until the vacancy is filled.
5. **Provide direction to staff on any other preferred approach.**
Commission may propose or refine an alternative method for managing the vacant assignments.

Each option has different implications for workload distribution and timing, which can be discussed further during the meeting.
