Entitlement City Status

- Murrieta became an "Entitlement City" on July 1, 2021
- County handles administrative aspects for the City
- Being an Entitlement City means more funding for Murrieta
- Funding for FY 2025/26 is estimated to be \$577,000



FY 2025/26 CDBG Allocation Categories



Administrative Expenses

• Eligible to use 20% of \$577,000 toward administrative costs incurred by the County and City.

Public Service Projects (Non-profits)

• Per HUD regulations, up to 15% can be used for public service projects.

FY 2025/26 CIP - Recommendation

- Recommend funding \$375,050 for Pedestrian
 Safety Enhancement
 Capital Improvement
 Project (CIP)
- Install new and replace existing pedestrian ramp facilities to be compliant with ADA requirements.







Fiscal Impact

- Expenditure of approximately \$577,000 in CDBG Funds.
 - Nonprofits \$86,550
 - ADA Ped. Safety -\$375,050
 - Administration- \$115,400

Budget appropriations to establish revenue and expenditure budgets.





Recommended

- 1. Conduct a public hearing and receive community input on the allocation proposals;
- 2. Adopt a Resolution entitled: A Resolution Of the City Council of the City of Murrieta, California, Authorizing the Allocations of Community Development Block Grant Funds for Fiscal Year 2025/26;
- 3. Appropriate funding and create a budget for eligible projects and/or program activities; and
- 4. Authorize the City Manager to execute all related applications and agreements.
