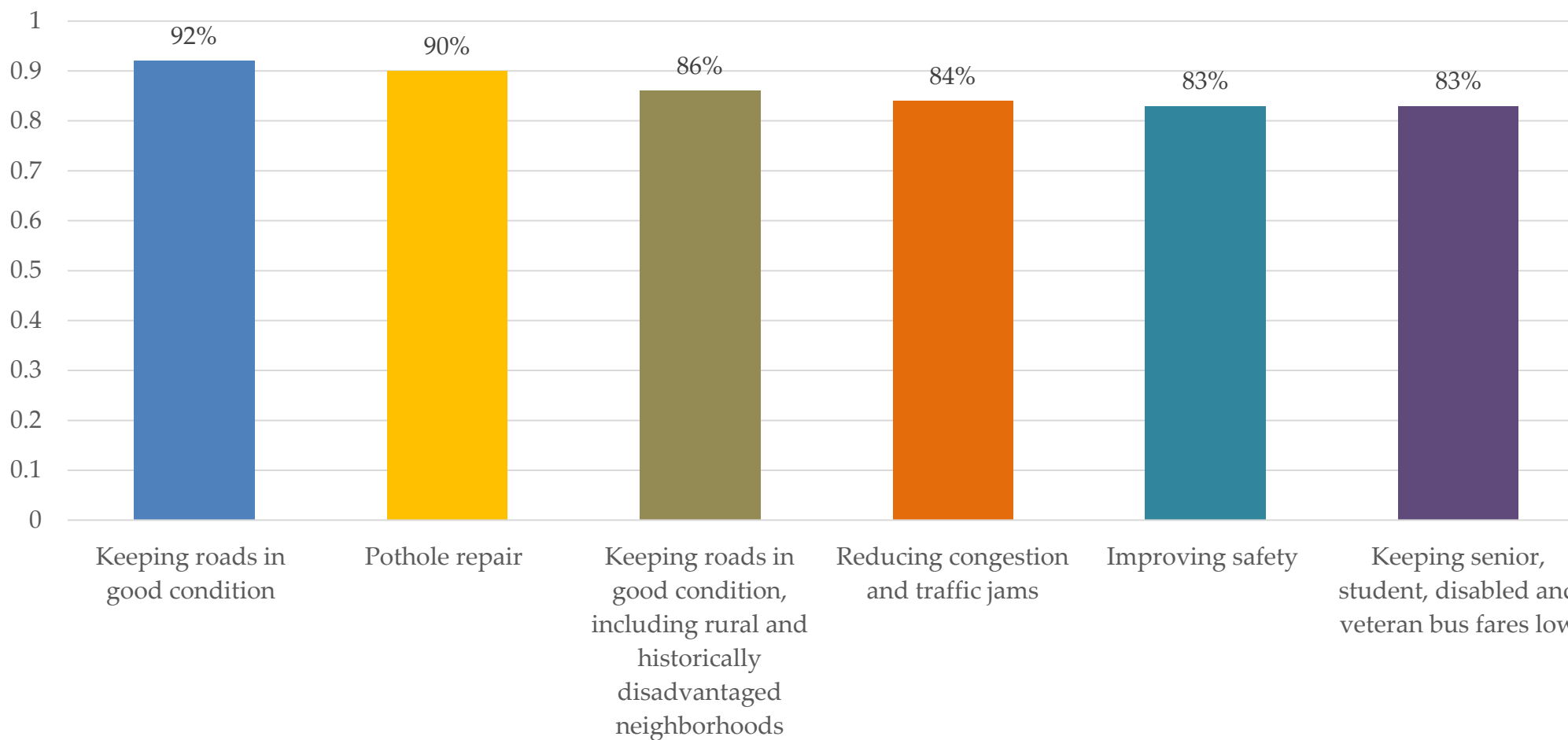

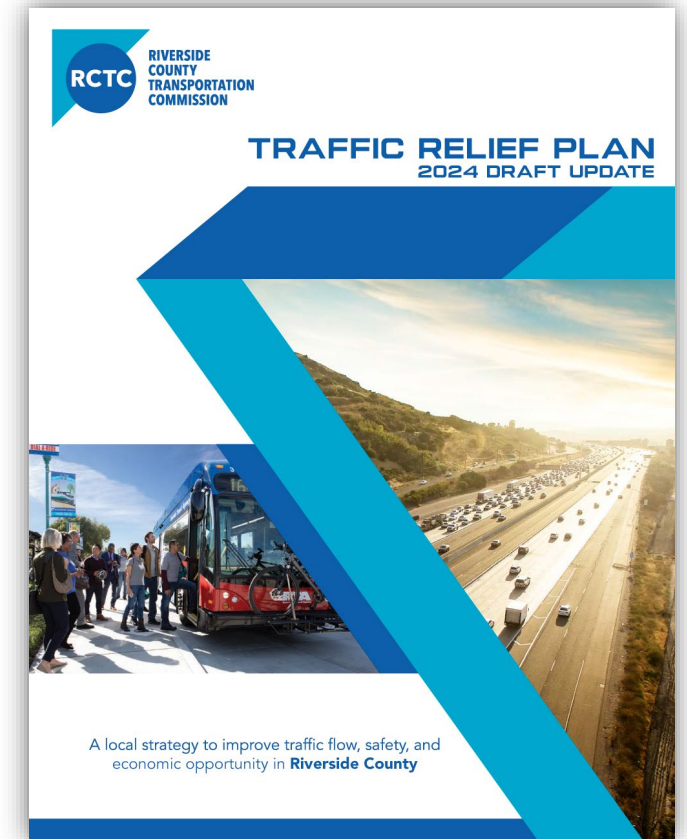
2023 Public Survey

Riverside County residents' transportation priorities ranking (very or somewhat important)

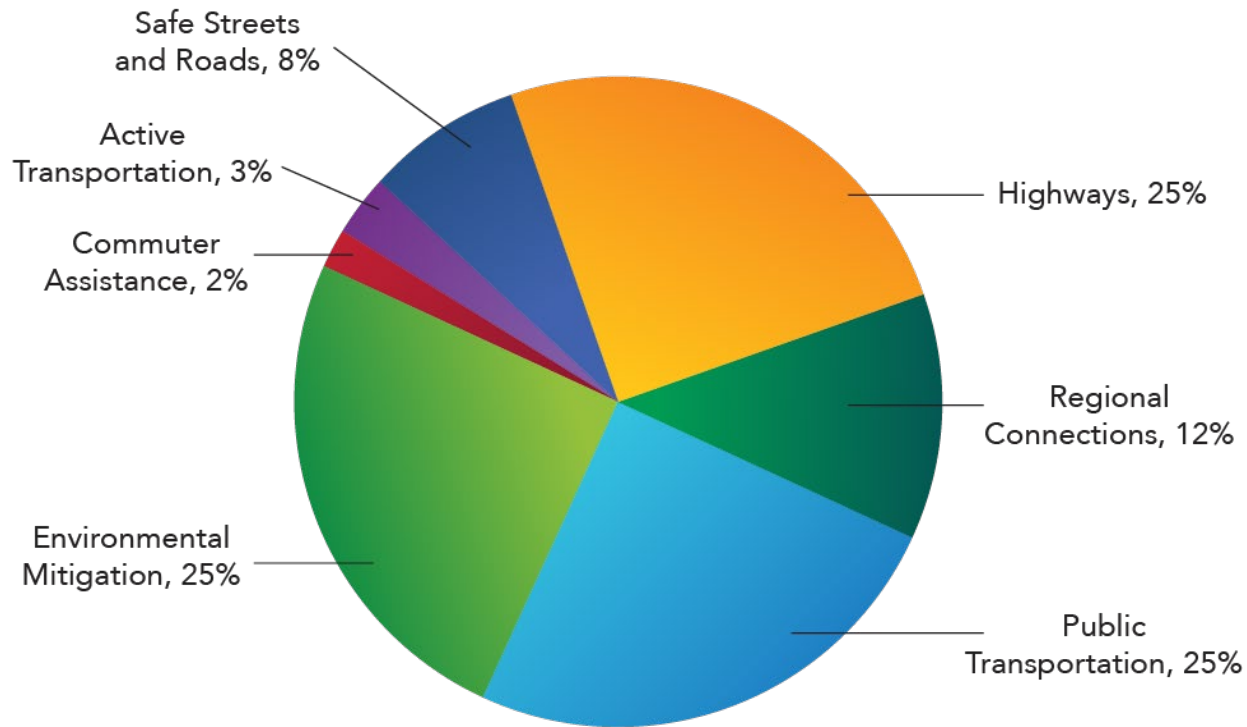


2024 Draft Traffic Relief Plan: Looking Forward

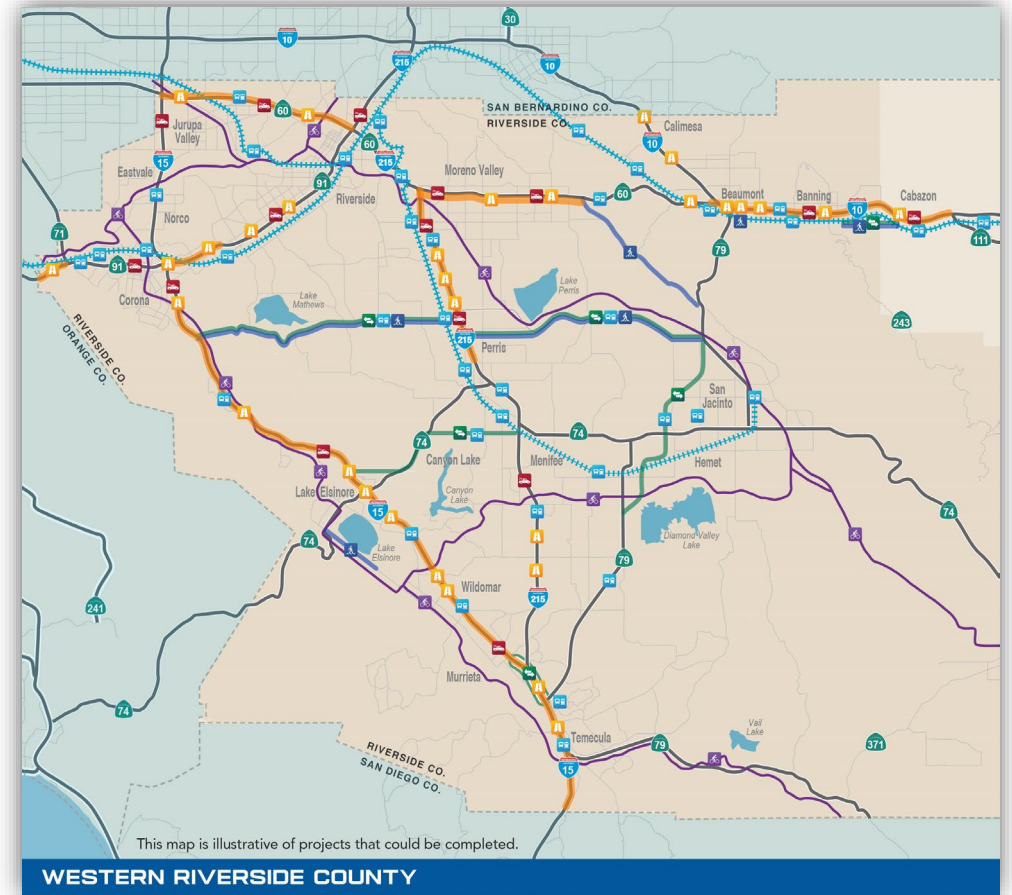

Highways

- New interchange on I-215 at Keller Rd in Murrieta and on I-215 at Garbani Rd. in Menifee
- I-15 ELPSE and final phase of the French Valley Parkway interchange

- Pothole repairs and road maintenance
- Local safety improvements, and traffic management systems

- Sustaining and expanding rapid/commuter bus services to Southwest Riverside County
- Increase frequency and safety on buses

- Elsinore-Ethanac Expressway

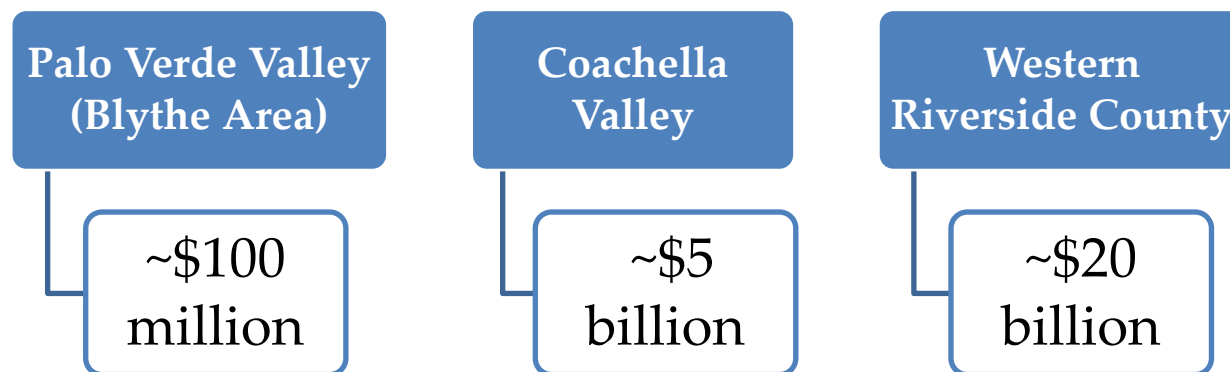

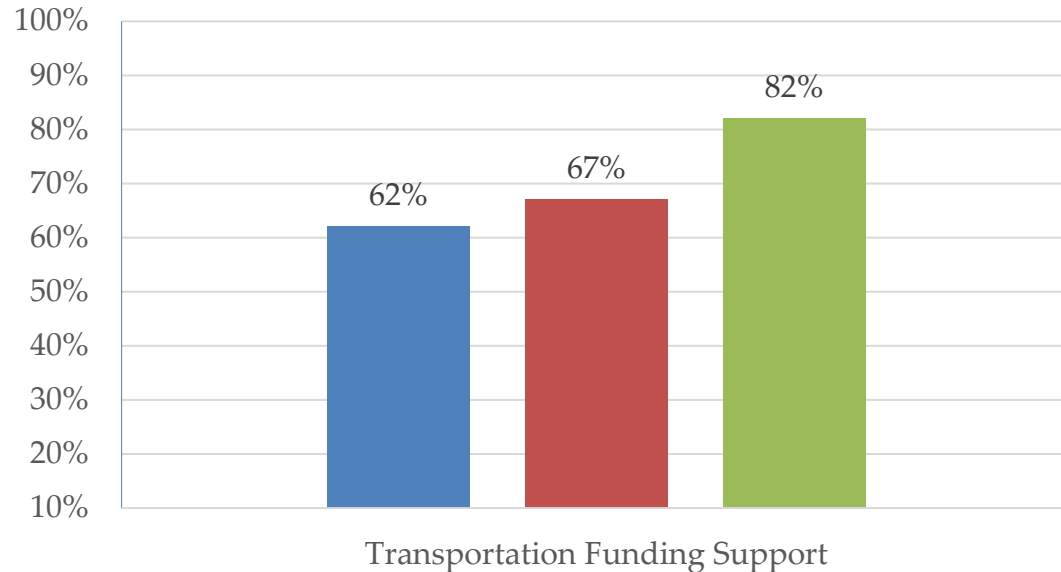

Accountability to Taxpayers

- Independent audits and mandatory reviews
- *Local Voice. Local Control* – No funds to be diverted to Sacramento or Washington D.C.
- No more than 1% can be used for administrative salaries

■ Support for funding measure: Wildomar, Lake Elsinore, Temecula, Menifee, Murrieta, Canyon Lake & surrounding area

■ Support for funding measure: Riverside County

■ Great or some need for funding

- **62%** of Murrieta, Wildomar, Lake Elsinore, Temecula, Menifee, Canyon Lake, & surrounding areas voters initially support transportation funding measure
- **67%** of Riverside County voters initially support a transportation funding measure
- **82%** of Riverside County voters see a need for transportation funding
