RESOLUTION NO. 25-4845

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MURRIETA, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING THE "GANN" APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025/26

WHEREAS, Article XIIIB of the California State Constitution (Propositions 4 and 111) places an appropriations limit on State and Local Government, including the City of Murrieta ("City") known as the Gann Appropriation Limit; and

WHEREAS, this appropriations limitation is based on proceeds of taxes adjusted annually, from the City's base year of 1990/91, for population growth, inflation, and transfers of financial responsibility from one government entity to another, by the population growth factor of either the City or for the County of Riverside, and by an inflation factor that is either the change in the California Per Capita Personal Income ("CCPI") or the change in non-residential construction for the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has received inflation and population data from the State Department of Finance and the change in non-residential construction from the County of Riverside Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder's Office to calculate the fiscal year 2025/26 appropriations limit; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to select the population growth factor and inflation factor providing the greatest ratio of change as shown below:

Change in CCPI 6.44% City of Murrieta Population Change 0.44%

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MURRIETA, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The recitals above are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION 2. That, in accordance with Article XIIIB of the Constitution of the State of California, the City has elected to make its calculation using the CCPI and City population growth data, such that the appropriations limit for the City of Murrieta, California, for fiscal year 2025/26 is calculated to be \$266,134,260 as shown on Exhibit "1" attached hereto and incorporated herein.

SECTION 3. That the City Clerk shall attest to the adoption of this resolution, which shall, in turn, have immediate effect.
